## FA CHARTER STANDARD COMMUNITY CLUB AWARD TO ST PETER F.C

St Peter FC have become the latest Jersey Club to gain the prestigious FA Charter Standard Community Award. They join the Jersey Wanderers to be among 275 Clubs who are recognised by the Football Association as being at the pinnacle of the Charter Standard programme.

The FA's Community Club initiative is aimed at developing the structure and quality of clubs and building on the foundation of the FA Charter Standard Clubs Scheme – it is a major priority of the long term FA Football Development Strategy.

St Peter FC President, Tom de Feu, said; "We are very proud to have been recognised by the FA for the standards we are achieving and the work that goes on within the club."

"Our application for the Award and the production of our four year strategic plan show our commitment to the future development of St Peter in the years ahead. Special mention must go to Brian Foulser and the Club committee who have been instrumental in the planning which has led to our achievement."

FA Community Clubs are required to meet criteria ensuring they provide opportunities for players irrespective of age, gender, background or ability. Along with development plans, clubs must provide football for a minimum of ten teams ranging from youths through to adults with qualified coaches who have an awareness of child protection issues and first aid.

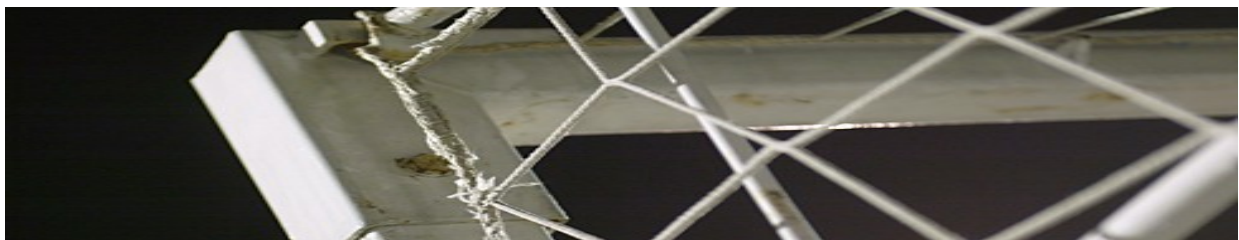
## CHARLIE DAZE, FIRST CHARTER STANDARD HOLIDAY COURSE IN JERSEY
